WHEREAS, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis declared a State of Emergency due to the Corona Virus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 has decimated the economy of Florida including, without limitation, the commercial, hospitality, restaurant, bars, sales, and manufacturing and trade sectors; and

WHEREAS, during this COVID-19 pandemic within our state, the Miami-Dade Legislative Delegation advised Florida Governor DeSantis to retroactively provide assistance to applicants of reemployment to the date when they lost their jobs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The above recitals are incorporated as if set forth in full.

Section 2. The Mayor and Village Council strongly expresses its support for the Miami-Dade County Delegations' letter to Governor urging him to allow applicants who have applied for reemployment benefits to have those benefits made retroactive to the date of the job loss.

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Section 3. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to Florida Governor Ron DeSantis.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 02-20

By virtue of the powers and duties vested in me as the Village Manager of the Village of Palmetto Bay, Miami-Dade County, Florida, in accordance with Section 252.38 of the Florida Statutes, under Chapter 14, Article III, Sec. 14-80 (a) of the Village Code, and pursuant to the Village's Declaration of a State of Emergency issued on March 13, 2020 and as extended, I hereby order the limited use of the **Village of Palmetto Bay's Coral Reef Park and Palmetto Bay Park**. The following Village of Palmetto Bay Parks will remain closed: **Thalatta Estate, Ludovici Park, Perrine Community House, and Perrine Wayside "Dog Park"**.

1. The Coral Reef Park and Palmetto Bay Park will be available for limited use by all visitors from sunrise to sunset, Monday through Sunday.
2. Parking lots will be open at Coral Reef Park and Palmetto Bay Park from sunrise to sunset. Signage at each entrance of the parking lots will be displayed with hours and rules.
3. All persons visiting the parks and park staff will follow CDC health department protocols and guidelines to include but not limited to six-foot social distancing, use of face masks, etc....
4. Visitors to these parks are encouraged to use the park for 1 or 2 hours intervals
5. Activities at the parks will be limited to a walking, jogging, hiking, and cycling on trails.
6. Walking and Nature Paths will be one way (directional).
7. Tennis Courts will be open for singles play and private one on one lessons only
8. Racquet Ball Courts will be open for individual play only. Competitive games are prohibited.
9. Coral Reef Park canoe and kayak launch will be open.
10. Restrooms will be open with restrictions to allow one person at a time to use the facility.
11. Visitors are encouraged to bring water bottles as water fountains will be out of service.
12. No recreational programming, pick-up games, organized sports, or activities will be allowed.

13. No groups of 10 or more will be allowed in parks; smaller groups must maintain social distancing following CDC/Health Department guidelines
14. Park Staff will take extra measures to keep open facilities clean and sanitized in accordance with CDC/State health guidelines of six foot social distancing.
15. Virtual recreational programming will continue on-line.
16. Amenities that will remain closed include:
 - Playgrounds and exercise equipment,
 - recreation buildings, and concessions,
 - volleyball courts,
 - bleachers and dug outs,
 - picnic shelters/pavilions/gazebo,
 - softball fields, baseball fields, football, and soccer fields (individual play only, no organized sports or pick-up games, and
 - skate park, basketball courts and all sports field lighting will remain off
17. No person shall violate the terms of this Emergency Order, except upon direct authorization of the Village of Palmetto Bay Policing Unit. Any violation of this Emergency Order shall be subject to fine, imprisonment, or both, in accordance with Section 14-88 of the Village Code.

This Emergency Order shall be effective **commencing April 29th, 2020 at 7:00 AM. (EST)** This Emergency Order may be cancelled earlier by action of the Village Manager.
