

Camping Rules & Regulations



NO ALCOHOLIC beverages will be allowed. NO SMOKING
Pets ARE NOT permitted.

If bringing a quick shade tent, tents larger than 10' x 10' will not be permitted. Tents will be placed a minimum of 5 ft away from the neighboring tents.

Grills, individuals pits, and BBQ's will not be permitted in the campsite. RV's and pop-up trailers will NOT be allowed.

This is a TENT ONLY camping event. There will be a community fire pit open to everyone. we encourage you to bring s'mores for your family to enjoy. All other food grilling and cooking over the fire pit WILL NOT BE PERMITTED.

Pre-registration is available on-line for \$15/tent at www.palmettobay-fl.gov. Pre-registration will end 2 days before the event date, or close earlier once capacity has been reached. There will be **NO ON-SITE REGISTRATION**. Tent spots are not reserved, it's first come, first serve. Only those who pre-register will be allowed to camp overnight.

Everyone must check-in on day of the event date. Once registered, camping groups will be assigned a number to place on the outside of the tent upon arrival. Staff and security guards will be checking tent numbers throughout the event.

Upon checkin-in, the adult identified as the "Responsible Party" of the group, and any 21yr. old adult, will be required to show PICTURE ID before collecting their tent number and wristbands. All members of the party must be present at the check-in table with their "Responsible Party" in order to collect their wristband. "Responsible Party" individuals must remain for the duration of the event with the group they are responsible for.

Those without wristbands after lights out (10:30pm) will be escorted out of the event.

All registered overnight campers must complete their tent/camps site set-up between **11am-4pm on event day**. All vehicles must be removed from the unloading area by 4:30pm.

Overnight campers will unload their camping gear first in the designated "unloading area" (along SW 77th Avenue) and then move immediately to park their cars at the other main parking lot located off of SW 152nd street. Parking at Holy Rosary St. Richard Catholic Church, 7500 SW 152th St. will only be available to patrons joining the event for the day. Please do not leave any valuables inside your car. The Village is also not be responsible for supervising your unattended camp area and is not responsible for any lost or stolen items/articles you leave behind. No vehicles will be permitted to park in the grassy swale areas along the park

Patrons who are not staying overnight are also welcome to attend and enjoy the scheduled activities and movies. There will be a designated area for blankets/chairs. Registration for this is NOT required. \$15 fee/tent is required for overnight campers!

Don't have a tent?, no worries. Nature Postings is offering families a camping equipment rental package to include: One 2-man tent, mini fans, (1) lantern, fire-pit and s'mores for \$45. Available while supplies last. Please reserve your equipment at www.naturepostings.com. **Registration with the Village is not required if selecting the rental option through Nature Postings.**

Archery, Kayak Adventures, and some activities, are first come first serve on the day of the event. On-site registration only.

Only vendors and organizations authorized by the Village Parks & Recreation Department will be permitted to sell food and beverages.

Parents are responsible for the supervision of their children at all times. Children around the camp fire pit need to also be closely supervised.

Jumping into or swimming in the Coral Reef Park canal and feeding the animals (cats, ducks, etc) will not be permitted.

Generators will not be provided and will NOT be permitted. Propane lanterns will NOT be permitted.

Flying objects for the use of sport (footballs, baseballs, softballs, kicking balls, frisbees, drones ,etc.) will not be permitted in the main camping areas. These activities will be allowed in the open field area across the canal.

Dispose of all trash in the proper containers during and after the event.

Those under the age of 21 will not be allowed to camp overnight unless accompanied by an adult over the age of 25.

Village staff reserves the right to remove those engaged in misconduct and not in full compliance of all aforementioned park rules and regulations. All participants are subject to follow all Village of Palmetto Bay Park Rules & Regulations.

NO REFUNDS and reservations are not transferable.

- Camping Gear (tents, blankets, pillows, sleeping bags, etc.)

- Inflatable beds (with battery operated air pump)
- Drinking Water/Water Bottles/Coolers
- Lawn/Beach Chairs
- Anti-bacterial Hand Sanitizer
- Extra Clothes (socks, shirts, shorts, etc.)
- Umbrella/Rain Gear
- S'mores Kit, marshmallows

Rules for the "REEL in the FUN"

Kid's Fishing Tournament



1. Pre-registration is not required to participate. If you camp overnight, on the online event registration, please check off the fishing tournament interest box if your child(ren) have an interest in participating. On event day, the parent/guardian of the child(ren) will be required to check-in and sign a waiver. If you did not check this box off during your time of the online pre- registration, you may still participate and sign-up onsite.
2. On event day, check-in will begin at 3:15pm pm with a short debriefing of tournament rules for all contestants. Start time is 3:30pm. * **Time is subject change with notice.**
3. The fishing tournament will take place on **both the west and east side of Coral Reef Park's canal** and only on the **SOUTH** side of the of the SW 77th entrance bridge and all the way down to the bridge that is closest to SW 152nd street (staying on the park side). There will be **NO fishing to the NORTH of the SW 77th entrance bridge**, as the kayak launches take place on this side. **Fishing on the two bridges is not permitted.** There will be signs, spray paint/flags identifying **boundaries** of the fishing tournament. A map is also provided. Please also note that there is bridge construction taking place this year and be cautious and avoid this area when fishing. ***There is orange construction fencing securing this construction area.***
4. This fishing tournament is **only open to children ages 5 to 15**. Parents/adults/guardians may assist their child(ren) bait hooks, net fish, remove fishhooks and untangle lines but, **MAY NOT** cast and retrieve for the children.
5. **ADULT SUPERVISION IS REQUIRED AT ALL TIMES FOR ALL CONTESTANTS!**
6. This will be a (40) minute timed tournament. The tournament time begins/ends with the sound of the boat horn. Once the horn goes off to start the tournament, ***no other contestants may join the tournament since the signing of the waivers and debriefing of the tournament rules are required for safety purposes.***
7. Only one pole/rod in the water at a time per child.
8. Getting in the canal is not allowed and waders are not allowed.
9. ALL fishing rules of the [Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission](#) will apply.
10. The tournament is catch and release ONLY!
11. Contestants are responsible for providing all necessary supplies to fish in the tournament (fishing pole/rod, fishing line, bait, hooks, etc.)
12. Live and/or dead bait will be allowed. Artificial bait like soft, plastic worms will be permitted but, **hard artificial lures with treble hooks will NOT be permitted.** Please

leave at least 8-10ft distance between you and another contestant. Spread out as much as possible.

13. Once a fish is caught, the child and adult must head to the fishing tournament gazebo (the small gazebo nearest the restroom) with the fish on the line for weigh-in. Once the fish is weighed and name of the child is logged onto the board, event staff will release the fish back in the canal and the contestant may continue fishing for the duration of the tournament.
14. If the horn goes off ***while a contestant is walking in the fish*** on the line for weigh-in, this fish will be considered.
15. The contestants bringing in the top (3) largest fish, determined by weight, will be awarded prizes (prizes TBD).
16. All contestants and adult supervisors must show good sportsmanship and at all times and “play” a fair game.
17. At the end of the tournament, please make sure you do not leave any litter, bait, fishing line, etc. in your area.
