

New Roadway Improvement Project to Start Week of May 27

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway improvement project the week of May 27, 2019. The project limits extend along SR A1A/Indian Creek Drive from 63 Street to Abbott Avenue in the City of Miami Beach.

The project will cost an estimated \$1.3 million. The work will take approximately six months to be completed. The project includes repaving and restriping the roadway; adjusting manholes and valves; reconstructing existing pedestrian ramps; replacing utility boxes within limits of sidewalk reconstruction; installing a shared bicycle lane “sharrows”; and enhancing signage and pavement markings.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to periodically close lanes. Construction will be done in stages to minimize impacts to the public during special events and peak periods of traffic. The department will make sure traffic continues to flow safely through the work zones.

SW 1 Street Bascule Bridge Replacement Project Has Begun
State Road (SR) 968/SW 1 Street from SW 7 Avenue to SW 2 Avenue

Miami, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has begun a bascule bridge replacement project and a detour is now in effect. The project limits extend along SR 968/SW 1 Street from SW 7 Avenue to SW 2 Avenue in the City of Miami. The project will last approximately three years. The project will cost an estimated \$67.2 million.

The project includes replacing the existing bascule bridge built in 1929, providing new bridge approach spans, providing a new bridge tender house, installing new seawalls along the Miami River, providing riverwalks under the new bridge, providing sidewalk connections to the bridge deck and Miami Greenway under the new bridge, relocating utilities, improving stormwater drainage and street lighting, reconstructing the roadway, installing an exclusive bicycle lane between SW 5 Avenue and SW 2 Avenue and updating sidewalks, curb ramps and crosswalks.

To complete this work safely, the SW 1 Street bridge over the Miami River will remain closed throughout the life of the project. Commuters wishing to cross over the Miami River into Downtown Miami are being detoured to northbound SW 7 Avenue in order to use the W Flagler Street bridge. W Flagler Street is a two-way road between 7 Avenue and 2 Avenue. A detour will be in place along N River Drive and S River Drive when approaching SW 1 Street. Access will be maintained to all properties.

Asthma is a chronic disease that affects the airways in the lungs and continues to be a serious public health problem. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, an estimated 24 million people, including over 6 million children, have asthma.

In support of Asthma Awareness Month, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County's Healthy Homes, Lead and Asthma Program (HHLAP) will distribute asthma related educational materials and will provide asthma education to the community at the Health District Center located at 1350 NW 14th Street, Miami, Florida 33125 on May 7, 2019.

Asthma is a condition that affects the lungs and if not well managed can result in repeated episodes of coughing, wheezing, breathlessness, chest tightness, loss of sleep and even death. Individuals can manage their asthma by knowing what may trigger an asthma attack and the physical warning signs of an attack. Common triggers include second-hand smoke, mold, dust mites, pet dander, cockroaches, pollen, strong odors, colds and flu, and in some instances exercise, stress, cold air and certain foods. When asthma sufferers know their triggers, they are able to avoid these elements and reduce the likelihood of an attack.

Although asthma cannot be cured, it is critical to take the necessary steps to reduce asthma attacks. Successful management includes knowing the warning signs of attack, avoiding things that may trigger an episode and following the advice of your healthcare provider.

They are the compassionate faces at the bedside and the healing hands that work tirelessly to ensure that each patient, adult or child, receives safe, quality health care.

This week, May 6 through May 12, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County is joining partners across the community to celebrate National Nurses Week and highlight the diverse ways nurses are working to improve health care. Today, there are more than 400,000 nursing professionals in Florida who play a vital role in maintaining the health of Floridians.

"Nurses are an integral part of our public health department and embody the common goal of care and devotion in treating, educating and helping others," said Yesenia Villalta, APRN, DNP, MSN, Health Officer/Administrator of the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County. "Their contributions, compassion and commitment to the profession support the health of our community each day."

Nursing: The Most Trusted Profession in the Country

Nurses make up a large portion of Florida's health care workforce. Almost everyone has had an interaction with a nurse, whether it be in a hospital, health clinic, private practice, home care setting or school environment where nurses are often the primary caregivers and patient advocates.

According to [Gallup's 2018 Honesty and Ethics Survey](#), more than four in five Americans (84%) rate the honesty and ethical standards of nurses as "very high" or "high," earning them the top spot among a diverse list of professions for the 17th consecutive year. With the exception of 2001, when firefighters were on the list after the 9/11 terrorist attacks, nurses have far outpaced all other professions since their addition to the list two decades ago.

Miami-Dade County also recognizes Wednesday, May 8 as School Nurse Day- a day to recognize Florida's more than 1,178 registered professional school nurses for the important work they do on behalf of students. School nurses are an essential component to the health and well-being of students, particularly those with acute and chronic health conditions.

During the 2017-2018 school year, Florida's school health nurses served more than 2.8 million students and supervised more than 25 million services to keep Florida's students safe and healthy while at school. For many of these students, without nursing services, attendance would decrease or students would be unable to attend school.


Percent Housing Units Without Vehicles

- On November 5, 2002, Miami-Dade County voters approved a half-penny surtax to implement the People's Transportation Plan (PTP)
- The People's Transportation Plan (PTP) is a broad based and long term program incorporating roadway and transit improvements
- Voters also approved the creation of a **Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust)**, an independent organization comprised of citizens who serve as volunteers with the mission to oversee expenditure of surtax revenue

ARTICLE XVI. ONE HALF OF ONE PERCENT CHARITABLE COUNTY TRANSIT SYSTEM SALES SURTAX AUTHORIZED BY SECTION 212.055(1) FLORIDA STATUTES (2001)

- Sec. 20-121. - Sales surtax levied.
There is hereby levied, and imposed a one-half of one percent discretionary sales surtax authorized by Section 212.055(1) Florida Statutes (2001) on all transactions which are subject to the state tax imposed on other transactions by Chapter 212, Florida Statutes (2001).
- Sec. 20-122. - Surtax rate, limitations.
The surtax rate shall be one-half of one percent on the amount of taxable sales and taxable purchases representing such transactions. The limitations, conditions and provisions contained in Section 212.054, Florida Statutes (2001) at the same time are hereby incorporated herein.
- Sec. 20-123. - Exemption from Sales Surtax.
All exemptions applicable to the discretionary sales surtax contained in Chapter 212, Florida Statutes (2001) are hereby incorporated herein as the same may be amended and supplemented from time to time including, but not limited to, the following:

1. The sales amount above \$5,000 on any item of tangible personal property shall not be subject to the sales surtax, however, charges for processing, calling arrangements, and defined in Section 212.054(1)(a), Florida Statutes (2001), shall be subject to the sales surtax. The same purchaser at the same time and, under the same terms of sale, for the same purpose, if two or more items of tangible personal property are sold to the same purchaser at the same time and, under the same terms of sale, for the same purpose, when assembled, combined, or otherwise put to use as a single unit, such items must be considered a sale for purposes of the \$5,000 limitation of sales surtax. The same purchaser at the same time and, under the same terms of sale, for the same purpose, when assembled, combined, or otherwise put to use as a single unit or part of a larger unit, such items must be considered a sale for purposes of the \$5,000 limitation when consumed in this state of the following are hereby specifically exempt from the sales surtax imposed by this article:







Surtax Collections & Expenditures - TOTAL




Approx. **\$3.2 billion** of surtax revenue has been collected since 2002

PEOPLE'S TRANSPORTATION PLAN

YEAR 2003-2031: RAPID TRANSIT IMPROVEMENTS
Construction of up to 88.8-miles of countywide rapid transit lines. (Capital Cost: \$7 billion)

- **Technology and Corridor Improvements:** Two corridors, totaling 26.7 miles of rapid transit, have completed the planning phase and are ready to enter into final design and construction -- the North Corridor and East-West Corridor.
- The North Corridor is a 9.5-mile heavy rail alternative, running from the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Metrorail Station, along NW 27th Avenue to NW 215th Street (Miami-Dade/Broward County line), with proposed stations at Northside Shopping Center, MDC-North Campus, City of Opa-locka, Palmetto Expressway, Corridor West of the Center, Pro-Player Stadium and the Florida Turnpike. The second segment of the original Rapid Transit Program will receive top priority to go into the final design and construction phase. (Capital Cost: \$2.5 billion)
- The East-West Corridor consists of two segments, one from the Florida Turnpike West to Palmetto Expressway (SR 826) and from the Palmetto, through Miami International Airport, downtown Miami, and to the Port of Miami, 6-miles and 11.2 miles respectively. These sites have been identified as potential station locations: Florida Turnpike, NW 107th Avenue, NW 57th Avenue, NW 87th Avenue, Millam Dairy Road, Blue Lagoon area, Miami Intermodal Center, NW 27th Avenue, Orange Bowl, Government Center (downtown Miami), and the Port of Miami. (\$2,789 million)
- The remaining 62.2-miles of rapid transit lines need to complete federal, state and local planning processes to determine feasibility, technology, and corridor alignment. These corridors include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - **Eastington Heights/Airport Connector:** A 3.1 mile extension from the Eastington Heights Metrorail Station to the Miami Intermodal Center, located on the east side of Miami International Airport. (\$207 million)
 - **Baylink:** A 5.1-mile corridor between downtown Miami and South Miami Beach. (\$510 million)
 - **Kendall Corridor:** A 15-mile corridor with both east-west and north-south segments. (\$877 million)
 - **Northwest Corridor:** A 13.6-mile corridor from downtown Miami, through Little Haiti, to NE 215th Street, generally along the Biscayne Blvd/US 1 Corridor and Florida East Coast railroad right-of-way. (\$195 million)
 - **Rail Extension to Florida City:** A 2-mile extension along US1, consisting of two segments, one from Dadeland Metrorail Station to Cutoff Ridge, a second segment from Cutoff Ridge to Florida City. (\$948 million)
 - **Douglas Road Extension:** A 4.4-mile corridor from the Douglas Road Metrorail Station to the Miami Intermodal Center. (\$280 million)

PEOPLE'S TRANSPORTATION PLAN

YEAR 2003--2008: BUS SERVICE IMPROVEMENTS (Capital Cost: \$90 million)

- Increases bus fleet from 700 to 1335.
- Increases current service miles from 27 million miles to 44 million miles.
- Increases operating hours from 1.9 million hours to 3.3 million hours.
- Utilizes minibuses on all new bus routes and in neighborhood/municipal circulator shuttle service.
- Adds mid-day, Saturday and Sunday services within 30-days of approval of a dedicated funding source using existing buses.
- Provides 15-minutes or better bus service during rush hour; 30-minutes or better during other periods; 24-hour service in certain major corridors.
- Replaces buses on a systematic basis to reduce operating cost and increase reliability.
- Constructs bus pull-out bays on major streets to expedite traffic flow.
- Implements grid system for bus service (north-south and east-west) on major streets and avenues with circulator service feeding main line bus service and rapid transit lines.
- Expands the bus shelter program throughout the County.
- Enhances and expands transit bus stop signage countywide; incorporate information technology at bus stop information program through enhanced marketing and advertising.
- Expands on successful municipal circulator program.



Bus and Circulator Routes in Miami Dade County




