Actual vs. Projected Revenue Stream









Permanent Closure of NE 12 Street

Miami, Fla. – On Monday morning, August 12, NE 12 Street between Biscayne Boulevard and NE 1 Avenue will be permanently closed to allow for the construction of the new I-395 bridges including the Signature Bridge. The closure of NE 12 Street will be completed in two steps (see attached map):

Monday morning, August 5 - The NE 12 Street slip ramp to westbound I-395/SR 836 and I-95 will be permanently closed. Drivers on NE 12 Street wanting to access westbound I-395/SR 836 and I-95 can continue west on NE 12 Street to access the ramp just west of NE 1 Avenue.

Monday morning, August 12 – NE 12 Street will be permanently closed from Biscayne Boulevard to NE 1 Avenue.

- Drivers on southbound Biscayne Boulevard or NE 2 Avenue wanting to access westbound I-395/SR 836 or I-95 can turn right on NE 13 Street, then turn left on NE 1 Avenue to access the westbound I-395 ramp. Please note that in order to accommodate this new traffic pattern, NE 1 Avenue will be converted to a two-way street from NE 13 Street to I-395.
- Drivers on northbound Biscayne Boulevard or other points south of I-395 will continue to access the westbound I-395 ramp via NE 11 Street and NE 1 Avenue.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. 

State Road (SR) 826/Palmetto Southbound Express Lanes Open Tuesday, August 6, 2019

Miami, Fla. – On Tuesday, August 6, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will open all southbound Palmetto Express lanes, from just north of NW 154 Street to south of West Flagler Street, and the new flyover ramp connecting southbound I-75 to southbound Palmetto Express lanes, weather permitting.

Workers will start installing express lane markers (ELMs) in the northbound direction from West Flagler Street to NW 154 Street when southbound express lanes are open. The work will be done from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. and will last approximately two weeks.

Tolls in the express lanes will be \$0.00 until further notice. When toll collection begins, overhead toll rate signs will advise drivers of the posted toll amount. Tolls will be collected electronically. Drivers using the express lanes will need to have an active SunPass, or other interoperable transponder – no exceptions, no TOLL-BY-PLATE.

Express lane entrance and exit locations are posted on overhead signs. **Do not drive over the ELMs to get in or out of the express lanes.** Access points to and from the express lanes are limited. Drivers should plan their trip ahead of time and know where to get in and out of the express lanes to reach their destinations. Attached please find detailed information about the Palmetto Express access points.

The express lanes are monitored for incidents 24 hours a day, seven days a week. If your vehicle breaks down, call the Florida Highway Patrol Communication Center at *347 for help. Remember to keep calm and stay inside your vehicle until help arrives.





Miami, FL - Samples of beach water collected at these locations did not meet the recreational water quality standard for enterococci. By state regulation, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County is required to issue an advisory to inform the public in a specific area when this standard is not met. An advisory has been issued because two consecutive water samples collected at these beaches **exceeded the Federal and State recommended standard for enterococci** (greater than 70 colony forming units of enterococci per 100ml for a single sample).

The advisory issued recommends **not swimming** at these locations at this time. The results of the sampling indicate that water contact may pose an increased risk of illness, particularly for susceptible individuals.

The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County has been conducting marine beach water quality monitoring at 16 sites, including the beach sites at these locations weekly since August 2002, through the Florida Healthy Beaches Program. The sampling sites are selected based on the frequency and intensity of recreational water use and the proximity to pollution sources. The water samples are being analyzed for enteric bacteria enterococci that normally inhabit the intestinal track of humans and animals, and which may cause human disease, infections, or illness. The prevalence of enteric bacteria is an indicator of fecal pollution, which may come from storm water run-off, wildlife, pets and human sewage. The purpose of the Florida Healthy Beaches program is to determine whether Florida has significant beach water quality concerns.

HEALTH OFFICIALS ISSUE MOSQUITO-BORNE ILLNESSES ALERT

~Additional Human Case of Dengue Infection Confirmed~

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County (DOH-Miami-Dade) today issued a mosquito-borne illness alert for Miami-Dade County. A case of dengue fever of local transmission has been confirmed in a Miami-Dade resident, making this one the third local case in 2019. These three local cases do not appear to be related.

Dengue is a virus spread through mosquito bites through the *Aedes* mosquitoes which also spread chikungunya and Zika virus. Most people infected with dengue have mild or no symptoms. Those that do develop symptoms recover after about one week.

The common symptoms of dengue are **fever** and **one or more of the following symptoms**: headache; eye pain (typically behind the eyes); muscle, joint, or bone pain; rash; nausea and vomiting; or unusual bleeding (nose or gum bleed, small red spots under the skin, or unusual bruising). Severe dengue can occur resulting in shock, internal bleeding, and death. If you or a family member develop the mentioned symptoms, visit your health care provider or local clinic.

DOH-Miami-Dade continues to advise the public to remain diligent in their personal mosquito protection efforts by remembering to “**Drain and Cover.**”

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying.

- Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.
- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.
- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

COVER skin with clothing or repellent.

- Clothing - Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.
- Repellent - Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.
 - Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthane-diol, and IR3535 are effective.

- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

Tips on Repellent Use

- Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.
- Products with concentrations of up to 30 percent DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide) are generally recommended. Other U.S. Environmental Protection Agency-approved repellents contain picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthane-diol, or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. Look for active ingredients to be listed on the product label.
- Apply insect repellent to exposed skin, or onto clothing, but not under clothing.
- In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is age-appropriate. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under the age of three years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old.
- Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.
- If additional protection is necessary, apply a permethrin repellent directly to your clothing. Again, always follow the manufacturer's directions.

COVER doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house.

- Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.
