

- The Monthly bar reports the results for September 2019
- The QTD bar reports the month of September 2019 for the quarter.
- The YTD columns report the expenditures for the months of October 2018 through September 2019.



The highlights for the Month of September 2019 are as follows:

- The expected norm is 8.33% per month and a total thru September of 100%.
- Most departments were under the expected norm of 8.33% except General Government due to payment to Hancock Bank for library loan principal and interest.
- As of September 2019, the Village of Palmetto Bay expenditures are operating under budget by 10.77% (NOTE: as of this date the payment for Police in the amount of \$1,416,698 has not been paid which represents about 9%). The 10.77% represents the difference between the year to date actual total operating and the percentage of the year to date budget and does not consider seasonal or quarterly expenditures.




Code Compliance Revenue 2018-2019 (Lot Clearing, Citation, and Special Master)






Customer Service Evaluation 2018-2019

Actual vs. Projected Revenue Stream







Municipal Circulator Spotlight

The Town of Miami Lakes was incorporated in December 2002, becoming Miami-Dade County's 31st municipality and one of its youngest. When the Peoples' Transportation Plan (PTP) was approved, Miami Lakes began receiving surtax funds along with the other eligible cities. With more than 30,000 residents and a strong business community, Miami Lakes put its surtax fund allocation to use implementing both transit and transportation projects to meet the mobility needs of the community. Miami Lakes launched its shuttle bus service in 2004 providing connectivity for residents and visitors trips to major destinations throughout the community and to the County's Metrobus system. The transit service was enhanced with the installation vintage-style aluminum bus shelters along the major thoroughfares served by the buses to protect riders from inclement weather. Miami Lakes then switched to on-demand service in April 2019 through a partnership with Freebee using ecofriendly electric vehicles to provide on-demand transit service. The Freebee service has shown a 40% increase in ridership over the summer period compared to last year. The on-demand service has helped diversify the rider base and has helped to provide age friendly transportation services to our elderly community.



Miami Lakes dedicates all its' PTP dollars to improve transportation and enhance mobility for residents and visitors. Surtax proceeds have helped the Town leverage grant funding to expand the Complete Streets and Greenways/Trail Plan. The Town currently has two 10 ft. Shared-use Greenway Trail projects under construction located along NW 60th Avenue and Miami Lakeway, which are funded with PTP dollars. The completion of these projects will help further the Town's commitment to improve alternative mobility for the community.

Samples of beach water quality collected at **Crandon North, Crandon South, Virginia Key Beach, Cape Florida, and Dog Beach along Rickenbacker Causeway** beach sites did not meet the Federal and State recommended recreational water quality standard for enterococci (greater than 70 colony forming units of enterococci per 100 ml for a single sample). By state regulation, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County is required to issue an advisory to inform the public in a specific area when this standard is not met. While beach water quality for the **Key Biscayne beach site (Beach Club)** did not exceed the standard for enterococci, it was close to exceeded. Given the location of **Key Biscayne beach site (Beach Club)** within the sites that exceeded the standard an advisory has been issued for all six beach sites referenced above.

The advisory issued recommends **not swimming** at these locations at this time. The results of the sampling indicate that water contact may pose an increased risk of illness, particularly for susceptible individuals.

The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County has been conducting marine beach water quality monitoring at 16 sites, including the beach sites at these locations weekly since August 2002, through the Florida Healthy Beaches Program. The sampling sites are selected based on the frequency and intensity of recreational water use and the proximity to pollution sources. The water samples are being analyzed for enteric bacteria enterococci that normally inhabit the intestinal track of humans and animals, and which may cause human disease, infections, or illness. The prevalence of enteric bacteria is an indicator of fecal pollution, which may come from storm water run-off, wildlife, pets and human sewage. The purpose of the Florida Healthy Beaches program is to determine whether Florida has significant beach water quality concerns.

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County (DOH-Miami-Dade) is under a mosquito-borne illness alert. A case of dengue fever of local transmission has been confirmed in a Miami-Dade resident, making this the fourth local case in 2019. These four local cases do not appear to be related.

Dengue is a virus spread through mosquito bites through the *Aedes Aegypti* mosquitoes which also spread chikungunya and Zika virus. Most people infected with dengue have mild or no symptoms. Those that do develop symptoms recover after about one week.

The common symptoms of dengue are **fever** and **one or more of the following symptoms**: headache; eye pain (typically behind the eyes); muscle, joint, or bone pain; rash; nausea and vomiting; or unusual bleeding (nose or gum bleed, small red spots under the skin, or unusual bruising). Severe dengue can occur resulting in shock, internal bleeding, and death. If you or a family member develop the mentioned symptoms, visit your health care provider or local clinic.

DOH-Miami-Dade continues to advise the public to remain diligent in their personal mosquito protection efforts by remembering to “**Drain and Cover.**”

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying.

- Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.
- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.
- Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week
- Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

COVER skin with clothing or repellent.

- Clothing - Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.
- Repellent - Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.
 - Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthane-diol, and IR3535 are effective.

- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

Tips on Repellent Use

- Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before you apply a repellent. Some repellents are not suitable for children.
- Products with concentrations of up to 30 percent DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide) are generally recommended. Other U.S. Environmental Protection Agency-approved repellents contain picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, para-menthane-diol, or IR3535. These products are generally available at local pharmacies. Look for active ingredients to be listed on the product label.
- Apply insect repellent to exposed skin, or onto clothing, but not under clothing.
- In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is age-appropriate. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), mosquito repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under the age of three years. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old.
- Avoid applying repellents to the hands of children. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.
- If additional protection is necessary, apply a permethrin repellent directly to your clothing. Again, always follow the manufacturer's directions.

COVER doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house.

- Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

- Clothing - Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present.
- Repellent - Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.
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- Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than 2 months old.

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
