AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, RELATING TO APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR MOSQUITO CONTROL; FINDING THAT AN EMERGENCY EXISTS REGARDING MOSQUITO CONTROL; APPROPRIATING \$75,000 FOR MOSQUITO CONTROL; PROVIDING FOR ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT, SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by Mayor Eugene Flinn)

WHEREAS, Section 4.4 (5) of the Village Charter permits the Village Council to make appropriations by an emergency ordinance; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists with respect to mosquito control, specifically *Aedes aegypti* mosquitos, the specific type identified to be carrier of the ZIKA virus, for which an additional appropriation is an appropriate response.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 The foregoing whereas clauses are incorporated herein.

Section 2 The Village Council hereby finds an emergency currently exists with respect to mosquito control for specifically *Aedes aegypti* mosquitos, the specific type identified to be carrier of the ZIKA virus, for which an additional appropriation is an appropriate response.

Section 3 The Village Council hereby appropriates \$75,000 for actions related to mosquito control and approves, without further action of this Council, the Manager securing such services and contracts required to effectuate such mosquito control that is required to protect the health, safety and well-being of residents and visitors of Palmetto Bay.

Section 4. The appropriation is supplemental to the existing County services for control of the *Aedes aegypti* mosquitos, the specific type identified to be carrier of the ZIKA virus, and not to supplant or conflict with County-wide mosquito control.

Section 5. Conflicting Provisions. The provisions of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Palmetto Bay, Florida and all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable, and if any sentence, section, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sentences, sections, clauses or phrases of the Ordinance, but they shall remain in effect it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

Section 7. Codification. It is the intention of the Village Council and it is hereby ordained the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made part of the Code of

1 Ordinances of the Village of Palmetto Bay, Florida, that sections of this Ordinance may be  
2 renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intentions, and that the word "Ordinance" shall be  
3 changed to "Section" or other appropriate word.

5 **Section 8.** **Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon  
6 enactment.

25 WHEREAS, the Village of Palmetto Bay is committed to the safety and livability of its  
26 residential neighborhoods; and  
27

28 WHEREAS, Resolution 2015-61 authorized expenditures for the purchase and  
29 installation of temporary speed hump devices on local residential streets; and  
30

31 WHEREAS, in response to numerous requests for traffic calming in various locations  
32 throughout the Village of Palmetto Bay, in December of 2015, the Public Services Department  
33 commenced a pilot program for placement of temporary speed hump devices for a 90-day period  
34 at locations that were identified in the June 18, 2015 Traffic Calming Initiative Presentation; and  
35

36 WHEREAS, temporary speed humps have been placed in accordance with the Village's  
37 Traffic Calming Request Policies and Procedures and Miami Dade County Traffic Flow  
38 Modification Street Closure(s) Procedures at various locations throughout the Village; and  
39

40 WHEREAS, the temporary speed hump devices installed effectively reduced speeds to  
41 25 mph or less with nominal reduction in volume; and  
42

43 WHEREAS, SW 77<sup>th</sup> Avenue, SW 174<sup>th</sup> Street, SW 83<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, SW 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, and  
44 SW 94<sup>th</sup> Avenue are two lane local streets that provide primarily north and south connectivity  
45 through residential areas within the Village of Palmetto Bay; and  
46

47 WHEREAS, Village Administration has determined that speed tables are the most  
48 appropriate type of traffic calming device for placement on SW 77<sup>th</sup> Avenue, SW 174<sup>th</sup> Street, SW

1 83<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, SW 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, and SW 94<sup>th</sup> Avenue for the efforts of reducing speeding of  
2 vehicles; and  
3

4 **WHEREAS**, based on field observations and data collected relevant to (traffic intrusion,  
5 excessive traffic volume, speeding, traffic conditions, etc.), staff recommends the installation of  
6 permanent speed tables; and  
7

8 **WHEREAS**, Administration requested and received proposals and pricing from three  
9 contractors for construction of asphaltic speed tables at various locations throughout the Village  
10 of Palmetto Bay; and  
11

12 **WHEREAS**, the lowest, most responsive proposal received was from Williams Paving  
13 Company for an amount of \$5,985.00 per speed table installed; and  
14

15 **WHEREAS**, (Exhibit 1) details the location and number of speed tables planned for  
16 immediate installation; and  
17

18 **WHEREAS**, the school year for fiscal-year 2016-17 is approaching, the volume and  
19 speed of traffic will once again exceed the peak hour speed and traffic volume per hour threshold  
20 value which defines the point at which a local residential street begins to lose its livability once  
21 the school year commences; and  
22

23 **WHEREAS**, Village Administration finds that this Resolution is in the best interest and  
24 welfare of the residents of the Village of Palmetto Bay and is requesting that the Village Council  
25 authorize the Village Manager to execute an agreement with Williams Paving Company for the  
26 construction of speed tables in five different locations within the Village of Palmetto Bay,  
27 specifically 2 on SW 77<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Old Cutler Road and SW 176<sup>th</sup> Street, 2 on SW 174<sup>th</sup>  
28 Street between Old Cutler Road and SW 77<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 2 on SW 83<sup>rd</sup> Avenue between SW 180<sup>th</sup>  
29 Street and SW 184<sup>th</sup> Street, 2 on SW 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue between SW 174<sup>th</sup> Street and SW 182<sup>nd</sup> Street,  
30 and 3 on SW 94<sup>th</sup> Avenue between SW 176<sup>th</sup> Street and SW 183<sup>rd</sup> Terrace for an amount of  
31 \$5,985.00 per speed table with a total project cost not to exceed \$90,000.






Figure 3B-31. Advance Warning Markings for Speed Humps






- The third line is shown as a dimensioned distance of 18 ft closer to, or 62 ft in advance of, the hump and is shown as a dimension of 3 ft wide.
- The fourth line is shown as a dimensioned distance of 16 ft closer to, or 46 ft in advance of, the hump and is shown as a dimension of 4 ft wide.
- The fifth line is shown as a dimensioned distance of 14 ft closer to, or 32 ft in advance of, the hump and is shown as a dimension of 5 ft wide.
- The sixth line is shown as a dimensioned distance of 12 ft closer to, or 20 ft in advance of, the hump and is shown as a dimension of 6 ft wide.
- The seventh line is shown as a dimensioned distance of 10 ft closer to, or 10 ft in advance of, the hump and is shown as a dimension of 7 ft wide.
- The eighth and last line is shown as a dimensioned distance of 8 ft closer to, or 2 ft in advance of, the hump and is shown as a dimension of 8 ft wide.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-\_\_\_

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO MIAMI-DADE COUNTY’S PREEMPTION OF THE VILLAGE’S HOME RULE POWERS AS PROPOSED IN THE DRAFT OF THE MANDATORY WORKFORCE HOUSING ORDINANCE; URGING THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS NOT TO APPLY THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE WITHIN ANY OBJECTING MUNICIPALITY; PROVIDING FOR TRANSMITTAL; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by Mayor Eugene Flinn)

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is considering the adoption of a Mandatory Workforce Housing Ordinance (the “County Ordinance”) which passed first reading as County Agenda Item 4(J) on June 7, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council finds that if the County Ordinance is adopted in the form in which it is proposed, it is hereby subject to objection and opposition upon, but not limited to, each of the following grounds:

- There is a significant question of whether or not application of the proposed Ordinance within municipalities exceeds the County’s charter based regulatory authority.
• The County Ordinance interferes with Municipal Home Rule Powers which are provided by Article VIII, Section II of the Florida Constitution and codified in Section 166.021, F.S.
• The County Ordinance may create a legal conflict with the Village’s Zoning code which does not provide a mechanism for the proposed bonuses. If the County Ordinance is found to be valid and within their authority, the Village would be required to amend its Zoning Code to provide for the density bonuses of up to 25% in the Village’s residential zoning districts.
• The County Ordinance creates a legal conflict with the Village’s Comprehensive Plan. Residential land use categories do not provide for the density permitted under the County’s proposed density bonuses and, if the County Ordinance is found to be valid and within their authority, the Village would need to amend its Comprehensive Plan by increasing densities up to 25% in the Village’s residential land use categories or providing a bonus mechanism for workforce housing; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council applauds the intent of the sponsoring commissioner and others in desiring to encourage the availability of workforce housing, the Village Council respectfully and strongly objects to the County Ordinance’s proposed imposition of a mandatory workforce housing methodology within the Village of Palmetto Bay; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Palmetto Bay provides for affordable and workforce housing in the higher density areas of the Village and such a component has been identified in the

1 Village's Comprehensive Plan; and

3 **WHEREAS**, the Village Council requests that the County Ordinance shall not be  
4 applicable within the Village of Palmetto Bay or any other objecting municipality.

15 mandatory workforce housing approach, and respectfully urges the Board of County  
16 Commissioners to reject the proposed County Ordinance or to amend the proposed County  
17 Ordinance to provide that the County Ordinance shall not be applicable within the Village of  
18 Palmetto Bay or any other objecting municipality.

19  
20 **Section 3. Workforce Housing Options.** That the Village Council welcomes and  
21 invites the Board of County Commissioners to assist in forming and working with a task force of  
22 municipalities to develop workforce housing initiatives which comply with applicable laws.

24 **Section 4. Transmittal.** That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a copy  
25 of this Resolution to the Mayor of Miami-Dade County, the Board of County Commissioners,

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO AMEND FLORIDA LAW BY ADDING ENHANCED PENALTIES FOR FELONIES AND MISDEMEANORS COMMITTED AGAINST LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, FIREFIGHTERS, AND EMERGENCY SERVICES PERSONNEL DUE TO THEIR EMPLOYMENT STATUS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by Mayor Eugene Flinn)**

**WHEREAS**, in 1989, the Florida Legislature enacted several statutes designed to address the issue of hate crimes. F.S. 775.085 was created to increase penalties for convictions of crimes where there was evidence of certain prejudice; and

**WHEREAS**, the Legislature enacted the Hate Crimes Reporting Act, F.S. 877.19, that requires law enforcement agencies to report hate crimes to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE); and

**WHEREAS**, the 1995 report of the Florida Attorney General found that a hate crime is among the most insidious acts taken by one person against another, founded in prejudice and intolerance and defined a hate crime as an act committed or attempted by one person or group against another person or group, or their property, that in any way constitutes an expression of hatred toward the victim based on his or her personal characteristics; and

**WHEREAS**, under F.S. 775.085, criminal penalties are enhanced for such hate-based acts; and

**WHEREAS**, there have been an increasing number of hate crimes against law enforcement, firefighters and emergency personnel.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA,**

**Section 1.** That the Village Council hereby urges the Florida Legislature to amend F.S. 775.085 to include employment as law enforcement officers, firefighters, and emergency services personnel among the classifications that are protected against hate crimes as follows:

775.085 Evidencing prejudice while committing offense; reclassification.

(1)(a) The penalty for any felony or misdemeanor shall be reclassified as provided in this subsection if the commission of such felony or misdemeanor evidences prejudice based on the race, color, ancestry, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, national origin, homeless status, mental or physical disability, ~~or~~ advanced age of the victim, or because of actual or perceived employment as a law enforcement officer, firefighter, or emergency services personnel:

1. A misdemeanor of the second degree is reclassified to a misdemeanor of the first degree.

- 1 2. A misdemeanor of the first degree is reclassified to a felony of the third  
2 degree.
- 3
- 4 3. A felony of the third degree is reclassified to a felony of the second degree.
- 5
- 6 4. A felony of the second degree is reclassified to a felony of the first degree.
- 7
- 8 5. A felony of the first degree is reclassified to a life felony.
- 9

10 (b) As used in paragraph (a), the term:

11  
12 1. “Mental or physical disability” means that the victim suffers from a condition  
13 of physical or mental incapacitation due to a developmental disability, organic brain  
14 damage, or mental illness, and has one or more physical or mental limitations that restrict  
15 the victim’s ability to perform the normal activities of daily living.

16  
17 2. “Advanced age” means that the victim is older than 65 years of age.

18  
19 3. “Homeless status” means that the victim:

20  
21 a. Lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence; or

22  
23 b. Has a primary nighttime residence that is:

24  
25 (I) A supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to  
26 provide temporary living accommodations; or

27  
28 (II) A public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used  
29 as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.

31 4. “Emergency services personnel” shall mean anyone who provided emergency  
32 medical services and other public safety services to the scene of an emergency.

34 5. “Firefighter” means any firefighter regularly employed by a fire department of  
35 any municipality, county, or Special Fire Control District of the State of Florida.

37 6. “Law enforcement officer” means any active or retired municipal, county, or  
38 state law enforcement officer, state and county correctional officer, or Public  
39 Service Aids, and those employees of any municipal, county, state or federal law

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, IN SUPPORT OF LOWERING ENERGY COSTS AND REMOVING BARRIERS FOR SOLAR POWER AND SUPPORT FOR AMENDMENT 4 ON THE AUGUST THIRTEENTH PRIMARY BALLOT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by Mayor Eugene Flinn)**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Palmetto Bay was instrumental in the adoption of the Florida House Bill No. 7179 in 2010, which created Florida’s Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program expressly allowing local governments to finance improvements such as solar panels on properties; and

**WHEREAS**, as of May 1, 2016, the PACE program has financed over 1,437 projects, which includes several solar power projects with an estimated cost of \$43,730,144 within the Green Corridor; and

**WHEREAS**, unlike conventional power generation, solar power generates electricity with zero air emissions and no water use, thereby moving the county, state, and nation to a cleaner and more sustainable energy future; and

**WHEREAS**, Florida has the greatest potential for rooftop solar power of any state in the eastern United States. Yet, with 9 million electric utility customer accounts, Florida has only 8,500 customer-sited solar systems, in contrast with less sunny states such as New Jersey, which has over 40,000 customer-sited solar systems, but only half the population of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida tangible personal property tax is a tax on non-real estate property and has the effect of increasing the cost of solar power on many solar systems by 2 to 5 cents per kilowatt hour (kWh). Lowering the cost of solar power improves the economic benefit of solar power and can lead to significantly more solar power development; and

**WHEREAS**, Amendment 4 will appear on the August 30, 2016 primary ballot, which, if approved, would (1) Exempt the assessed value of a renewable energy source device from ad valorem tax on tangible personal property; and (2) Prohibit a property appraiser from considering the installation of a renewable energy source device in the determination of assessed value of real property for the purpose of ad valorem taxation; and

**WHEREAS**, as such, the Village Council hereby supports Amendment 4 as it would lower the costs and remove barrier of solar power within the State of Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Council finds that this Resolution is in the best interest and welfare of the residents of the Village of Palmetto Bay.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:**
