MINUTES

1. Call to Order
 - a. Mr. Mayo called the meeting to order at 6:44 p.m.

2. Approval of Minutes
 - a. Mr. Mayo motioned to approve the minutes from the October 7th meeting. Ms. Tabor seconded the motion. Minutes approved.

3. Public Comments
 - a. No public comments

4. Pending items/Updates
 - a. Continue to work with District on the Matrix
 - a. Ms. Regueira submitted to the committee an updated "Education Compact Matrix" with comments from the District. Notes that the matrix is a living document that will never be finished. Notable additions from the District:
 - i. South Region Curriculum Expo will be held Tuesday, November 10th at Palmetto High from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
 - ii. All aftercare offerings at Village schools
 - iii. College Tour Institute – 7 Village students will be participating. Dr. Buslinger-Clifford asked how these students were selected and which colleges the students will visit. Ms. Regueira will obtain this information and share it with the committee.
 - iv. Principal Breakfast in partnership with the South Dade Cultural Arts Center.
 - v. Dade Partners Program – partnerships with Village businesses. She notes low numbers for the Village schools, especially Palmetto High School (zero partners). Dr. Buslinger-Clifford notes no partners at Perrine Elementary. Ms. Regueira states that the information may not be complete and that these schools likely have many partners outside of the Village. States that the District would like to identify more partnerships within the Village. Mr. Mayo notes that Howard

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Drive has seven partners and that the Committee will discuss this further as a group. Also, committee members are assigned to schools and will discuss this with their assigned schools.

- vi. Two Palmetto High students are participating in the District's Office of Community Engagement's Honors and Executive Internship Program. District is reviewing the internship program for enhancements. Ms. Regueira asked whether there are internships available with the Village. Mayor Flinn suggests that Mr. Mayo meet with Ed Silva, Village Manager, about internship opportunities. Mayor Flinn states that this will be done in conjunction with the new Youth Advisory Committee. Mayor Flinn states that this internship program is designed to get students ready for the next step in their professional lives. Ms. Regueira says District is looking for opportunities in business and government. Mayor Flinn asked whether the District has an existing model for the Village to review. She will contact the Office of Community Involvement to ask for more information to assist the Village in developing its own internship program.
- vii. Pending items for the Village – Village invitation to the South Chamber to participate in the Committee and Village to establish Village Employee Service Program. Mr. Mayo and Mayor Flinn states that this will be discussed by the Committee.
- viii. iAttend M-DCPS: effort to increase attendance and addressing attendance issues (counseling parents and students) as attendance issues start to become apparent. In addition, iAttend involves indoor suspension vs. outdoor suspension. Ms. Rodriguez states that in lieu of suspension, students are sent to one of several "Student Success Centers" including one in Homestead. These centers have educators and counselors available. Dr. Buslinger-Clifford notes that establishing good attendance behavior in young children makes a large long-term impact.
- ix. Parent Academy Workshops – provided catalogue of 2015 workshops and will provide 2016 catalogue once it is available.
- x. "If You See Something Say Something" – partnership with Department of Homeland Security to report suspicious behavior. "Values Matter Initiative" – Mr. Mayo asked what role the Village has in this program. Ms. Regueira encourages Committee members to visit the website and review the different values to highlight the

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same values during the month in the Village. Mr. Mayo states that this will be discussed in committee.

- xi. Student Arts Recognition Program and other recognition programs – Mr. Mayo states that this will be discussed further by the committee.
 - xii. School Climate Surveys – Ms. Regueira states that 2015-16 results are available on District website.
 - xiii. iBus transportation for students – Mayor Flinn states that iBus market will primarily be youth and older residents. Village has signed onto Mayor Gimenez’s aging initiative and iBus will be part of this initiative. iBus study by Joe Coradino continues.
- b. Ms. Regueira also submitted to the committee information on the GO Bond for Village schools. Noted that Palmetto High School project is the second largest project in the GO Bond.
- c. Ms. Regueira reviewed the current legislative goals currently being discussed in Tallahassee.
- i. Student funding: increase by 5%.
 - 1. Specific increases for Safe Schools Funding and Exceptional Student Education (ESE).
 - 2. Modifying the calculation of funding for students taking virtual courses beyond the current school day (summer or after school). District pays for course but does not get reimbursed because funding is calculated by students taking courses during current school day only. District is offering extra courses without receiving any funding for it.
 - 3. Funding for extending school year for all students.
 - 4. Oppose unfunded state mandates (including extended school year which is currently unfunded).
 - ii. Value Adjustment Board Structural Changes
 - 1. Would like VAB appeal procedure to be revised to include a number of requirements that will allow appeals to be completed in a more timely manner. Bills being filed in Tallahassee. Dr. Buslinger-Clifford asks what level of support does the District have and do the bills have a chance of passing? Ms. Regueira notes that this has been 5-6 years in the making and that there is hope that this is the year they will pass.
 - iii. Accountability

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1. District would like a (1) transitional period for school and district accountability as well as teacher evaluation as state transitions to new assessment tools and (2) delay in computer based testing until all school districts have the necessary infrastructure to reduce the testing window and provide a pencil and paper option.
 - iv. Portable Pool Program
 1. 40 year old program is being suspended by Department of Health. District working to reinstate the program.
 - v. Virtual Education
 1. Modify current requirements to virtual education.
 - vi. Mr. Mayo asks what the Village can do with regard to these legislative initiatives. Ms. Regueira asked that the Village consider supporting some or all of these initiatives as a show of unity and strength.
5. New Business
- a. Village website update
 - i. Community Outreach Committee is working on website update. Mayor Flinn told this committee that the Education Advisory Committee is interested in participating in the update.
 - ii. Ms. Rodriguez states that tomorrow a video featuring all Village schools will be delivered tomorrow to Mr. Silva.
 - b. Review of school communication form
 - i. Mr. Mayo distributed to the Committee a “school Planning and Contact Form” for review and discussion. Form provides schools an opportunity to request to present to the Committee. Mr. Mayo will personalize to each school and send it to each committee member.
 1. Mr. Mayo will serve as liaison to Howard Drive Elementary
 2. Dr. Buslinger-Clifford will serve as liaison to Southwood Middle School
 3. Other school liaisons were assigned during September meeting
 - ii. Ms. Quick recommends amending the form or providing an accompanying letter inviting schools to attend meetings but also offering an option to send information to the liaison for presentation on behalf of the school. Ms. McMaster recommends removing the title from the form. Dr. Buslinger-Clifford recommends two sections to the form: one for information sharing and one for request to attend meeting. Mr. Mayo will work on a cover letter and updated form for distribution to the Committee.

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- c. Veteran's Park (moved up in agenda)
 - i. Mayor Flinn states it would be appropriate for a member of Committee to sit on the Veteran's Park Advisory Committee.
- d. Discussion concerning Miami-Dade County Public Schools legislative goals and their relationship to the items previously discussed
 - i. During October meeting, Committee discussed several legislative issues
 - 1. Increased funding: Mayor Flinn states that during Council meeting on November 2, 2015 the Council addressed some legislative issues including support of increased funding for schools.
 - 2. Class size amendment: Mr. Mayo asks whether there are any organizations with whom the Committee can join forces with to form a coalition in support of enforcing the class size amendment as written. Mr. Mayo believes United Teachers of Dade is a possibility.
 - 3. Community Schools: all electives for all schools; bring students back to local schools
 - ii. Mr. Mayo proposes a vote by the Committee to recommend to the Village Council that they support the School Board's top priorities for the upcoming legislative session. The Committee votes to recommend that the Village Council discuss the passing a resolution to support the following legislative agenda:
 - 1. Funding
 - 2. Value Adjustment Board Structural Changes
 - 3. Fair and Equitable Accountability Reform
 - 4. Academics
 - 5. Safety
 - 6. Virtual Education

Mr. Mayo notes that this recommendation does not commit the Village Council to anything more than a show of unity and support of the School Board and School District. Mr. Mayo will send an email regarding same on behalf of the Committee to council@palmettobay-fl.gov.
