**SUMMARY OF CURRENT SITUATION AND ACTIONS**

**WYNWOOD**

- On September 19<sup>th</sup>, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) lifted the travel advisory in Wynwood after no additional reported local transmission cases in the area since the beginning of August.

**MIAMI BEACH**

- The Florida Department of Health (FDOH) has expanded the Miami Beach local area of transmission to a 4.5 square-mile area from 8<sup>th</sup> Street to 63<sup>rd</sup> Street due to additional confirmed cases beyond the 1.5 square-mile area of 8<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> Street. *See attached map showing the expanded area of local transmission in Miami Beach.*

**FLORIDA HEALTH IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY**

- FDOH Zika testing for pregnant moms available at the following locations Monday - Friday (8:30am-3:00pm):
  - Health District Center, 1350 NW 14 Street, Miami, FL 33125.
  - West Perrine Health Clinic, 18255 Homestead Ave. Miami, FL 33157.
- The test entails a urine sample and blood work with results taking a minimum of two weeks to process. Pregnant women can contact FDOH's Epidemiology Division (305) 324-2400 to obtain Zika prevention kits.
- The Florida State Surgeon General and Secretary of Health have established a Zika hotline (855-622-6735) and Monday – Friday are issuing daily status reports on CDC-confirmed Zika cases by county. <http://www.floridahealth.gov/newsroom/index.html>.

**MOSQUITO CONTROL**

- The Mosquito Control Division will continue ground spraying by hand and truck spraying into next week in the 4.5 square-mile area in Miami Beach. Aerial spraying will continue in the 1.5 square-mile area of local transmission.
- The Department of Solid Waste Management will conduct Mosquito Abatement Training on Tuesday, September 27<sup>th</sup> at the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue (MDFR) Training Center (9300 NW 41<sup>st</sup> Street, Miami FL) in the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor auditorium from 1:30 pm to 3:30 pm.
- The Mosquito Control Division continues promoting the mosquito control *Drain and Cover* message via Miami-Dade County and FDOH webpages, and social media (Facebook and Twitter #drainandcovermiami). <http://www.miamidade.gov/solidwaste/mosquito-control.asp>



- Public Works crews actively treating drains against mosquitoes.


