**PALMETTO BAY, Fla.**, (July 2, 2010) – Park-goers can enjoy free, security-enabled wireless internet access over the holiday weekend, now that the Village of Palmetto Bay offers this new amenity at Palmetto Bay Park and Coral Reef Park.

Palmetto Bay, also known as The Village of Parks, is making it easier to get online. While visiting either park, by using the Wi-Fi search tool from a laptop, iPhone, Blackberry, or other portable device, simply look for the network, “**PBPWIFI**.” The security code to access Wi-Fi at Palmetto Bay Park and Coral Reef Park can be obtained by contacting the park office or staff. When the welcome page appears, simply click “begin.”

“This is an exciting new element we have added to our wonderful parks,” Mayor Eugene Flinn said. “Our continued effort to improve the visitors’ experience is enhanced by integrating wireless internet technology at Palmetto Bay Park and Coral Reef Park.”
