Village Partners with NLC to Offer Prescription Discount Plan for Residents

*Residents can save an average of 20 percent off retail
prescription prices at no cost to the Village*

PALMETTO BAY, Fla., (Sept. 15, 2009) – Village residents may credit District-1 Councilman Ed Feller, MD, for bringing a unique new prescription discount program to Palmetto Bay.

Starting today and FREE to residents, the prescription program offers savings to those who are without health insurance, a traditional benefits plan, or have prescriptions that are not covered by insurance. The Prescription Discount Card is made available to residents in collaboration with the National League of Cities ([NLC](#)) and is made possible through PalmettoBay membership in NLC.

"There are multiple ways this program is useful," says Councilmember Feller. "Everyone should get the card, consider their own situation, and use it when and were applicable."

The card is FREE to all PalmettoBay residents, regardless of age, income or existing health insurance. By using this card you may save an average of 20 percent off the regular retail price of prescription drugs at participating pharmacies. 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Incorporated in 2002, **The Village of Palmetto Bay** is a vibrant community of more than 25,000 residents nestled between Biscayne Bay and So. Dixie Highway, about 15 miles south of downtown Miami. The Village is governed by a five-member Council and operates under a Council-Manager form of government. Dubbed "The Village of Parks," Palmetto Bay offers an extensive system of attractive parks, unique recreational opportunities, and bay access.
