# Manager's Report

### **FINANCE**

# **February**

- The expenditures in March 2022 were \$792,190, 4.99% of the total budget, compared to budgeted expenditures of \$1,322,576, a savings of 3.34% for the month. Please note that this analysis is based on a straight-line allocation of the budget for the year, which is \$1,322,576 or 8.33% per month. This does not consider the timing of expenditures such as Police or seasonal events such as Summer Camp or Village events.
- YTD the Village has spent or 31.92% compared to budgeted expenditures of \$7,935,456 or 50%. Police fees for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter has not been paid which represents about 11% of the budget. With Police included we are 7.08% under budget.

    - As part of the Village of Palmetto Bay's Code Section 30-160, Art in Public Places (AIPP), Palmetto Venture Partners, LLC has presented to the Village's Art in Public Place Board on January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The proposed art in public place component is located at 9500 SW 174<sup>th</sup> Street in Palmetto Bay, and it is composed of a wall sculpture and sculpture walk located on the main building and the fencing surrounding the perimeter of the development. The artist selected is Seth Palmiter, a Florida-born artist who believes that the proposed art will be a bridge to the community because of its accessibility to all. Pursuant to 30-160, the AIPP associated cost of \$38,350,683 exceeds the AIPP program requirement of \$400,000 and, therefore meets the AIPP contribution.
  - Franjo Road AIPP Call to Artist Proposal: APPROVED via Resolution 2022-24
    - As part of the Village of Palmetto Bay's Code Section 30-160, Art in Public Places (AIPP) Advisory Board, the Franjo Road Traffic Circle Call to Artist was advertised in the Spring of 2021 on Café.com and received over ninety (90) proposals. The AIPP Advisory Board then summoned a shortlist of four (4) final artists to produce a maquette sample for their proposed art piece and were each paid a \$1,500 stipend. On January 20, 2022, the AIPP Advisory Board conducted Call to Artist Presentations via virtual GotoWebinar. As a result, the AIPP Advisory Board selected Michael Szabo as the artist to install a sixteen-foot (16') art piece named "Bloom", which is intended to inspire residents and visitors to the community to communicate. Pursuant to 30-160, the associated cost of the art piece on Franjo Road Circle is \$125,000, which meets the budgeted amount of the Call to Artist.
