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RESOLUTION NO. 2013-25

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING SENATE BILL 294 AND HOUSE BILL 619 RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES; ADDING CERTAIN NEW DRUGS TO THE SCHEDULE I LIST FOR ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION BY CLERK; **PROVIDING** FOR SEVERABILITY: THE VILLAGE PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTING RESOLUTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. [Sponsored by Mayor Shelley Stanczyk].

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WHEREAS, the Mayor and Village Council desire to establish their legislative agenda items and to express their concerns as to State legislative items; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Village Council support Senator Bradley with Senate Bill 294, and Representative Ingraham as to House Bill 619, in their efforts to update the "Controlled Substances Regulations;" and,

WHEREAS, the Bills seek to address the public safety risk of new synthetic substances being sold and abused in Florida; and,

WHEREAS, the Attorney General filed an emergency rule on December 11, 2012, that schedules several new synthetic cannabinoids, cathinones, and phenethylamines as Schedule I Controlled substances; and,

WHEREAS, this rule is temporary and scheduling will lapse when the rule expires on June 30, 2013, unless enacted by the Legislature as a law; and,

WHEREAS, the items identified are chemicals that act as cannabinoid receptor agonists, chemically, they are not similar, but they are "cannabinoid-like in their activity; or similar to amphetamines if "cathinone" like; and,

WHEREAS, these drugs, per the Attorney General, can cause short term side effects of increased heart rate, agitation, diminished requirement for sleep, lack of appetite, increased alertness and awareness, anxiety fits and delusions, and nosebleeds; and,

WHEREAS, more serious side effects include muscle spasms;, blood circulation problems, including increased blood pressure, kidney failure, seizures, muscle damage, loss of bowel control, hallucinations, aggression, severe paranoia, panic attacks, sharp increase in body temperature, risk of renal failure and cardiac arrest; and,

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WHEREAS, the proposed legislative items amend section 893.03, Florida Statutes, adding to the list of Schedule I controlled substances certain specified materials, compounds, mixtures, or preparations that contain hallucinogenic substances, or any of their salts, isomers, and salts of

isomers, if the existence of such salts, isomers, and salts of isomers is possible within the specific 1 2 chemical designation; and, 3 WHEREAS, the Bills amend section 893.135, Florida Statutes, and provide criminal 4 5 penalties for a person who knowingly sells, purchases, manufactures, delivers, or brings into this 6 State, or who is knowingly in actual or constructive possession of a specified quantity of specified 7 controlled substances; and, 8 9 WHEREAS, the Bills reenacts section 893.13(1)-(6), Florida Statutes, and section 10 921.0022(3)(b)-(e), Florida Statutes, relating to prohibited acts involving controlled substances and the Criminal Punishment Code, respectively, to incorporate the amendments made to s. 893.03, 11 12 Florida Statutes, in references thereto; and, 13 WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council in their desire to provide for the public welfare and the 14 health of our youth support the ongoing war on drugs through Senate Bill 294 and House Bill 619. 15 16 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS: 18 19 20 The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified as true and correct and Section 1. 21 are incorporated herein by this reference. 22 23 The Village hereby files its support of the legislative priority of Senator Section 2. Bradley with Senate Bill 294, and Representative Ingraham as to House Bill 619, in their efforts to 24 25 update the "Controlled Substances Regulations." 26 27 The Village Clerk is authorized to provide executed copies of this resolution Section 3. to the Village's lobbyist, and to the Florida Legislature, the Mayor of Miami-Dade County, each 28 member of the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners, as well as each municipal clerk in 29 Miami-Dade County for the purpose of distributing copies to members of their respective governing 30 31 councils. 32 This resolution shall be effective immediately upon its adoption. 33 Section 4. 34 PASSED and ADOPTED this 4th day of March, 2013. 35 Shelley Stancyk 36 37 38
