## SERVICING THE PETS OF SOUTH FLORIDA

The Humane Society of Greater Miami, in partnership with Miami-Dade Animal Services, is offering **FREE spay/neuter surgeries** for low-income residents in our community.

"The news couldn't be better! We are honored and ecstatic to be awarded the opportunity to provide free spay/neuter surgeries for low-income qualified residents and community cats at our south clinic location at 10700 SW 211 Street in Cutler Bay. On February 12th, we opened the doors of the Miami-Dade County Community Spay Neuter Clinic. This is a Miami-Dade Animal Services no kill project in partnership with the Humane Society of Greater Miami!" says Laurie Hoffman, Executive Director at the Humane Society of Greater Miami.

Over the next eight months, the Humane Society will be able to perform 7,400 spay/neuter surgeries at no cost for pets of low-income residents and for community cats at the South Clinic location. Anyone showing proof of low income can have their dogs or cats spayed/neutered at no cost and receive rabies vaccine. In addition, cats will receive a free FVRCP vaccine and dogs will receive a free DHPP vaccine. There will be animal transportation assistance available for those in need. Surgeries and vaccines will be available at low cost for the general public as well. Drop-off and pick-up hours for surgery are 7:00am to 7:00pm, Tuesday through Saturday, while the vaccine clinic open from 9:00am to 4pm, Tuesday through Saturday.

"This is a very significant step towards accomplishing our mission of reducing the number of homeless and abandoned pets," says Hoffman. "This past year, at our South Clinic alone, we performed more than 7,300 spay/neuter surgeries and with this free surgeries project we look forward to achieving even greater numbers to help our community's no kill efforts."

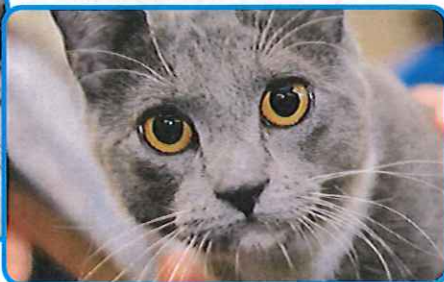

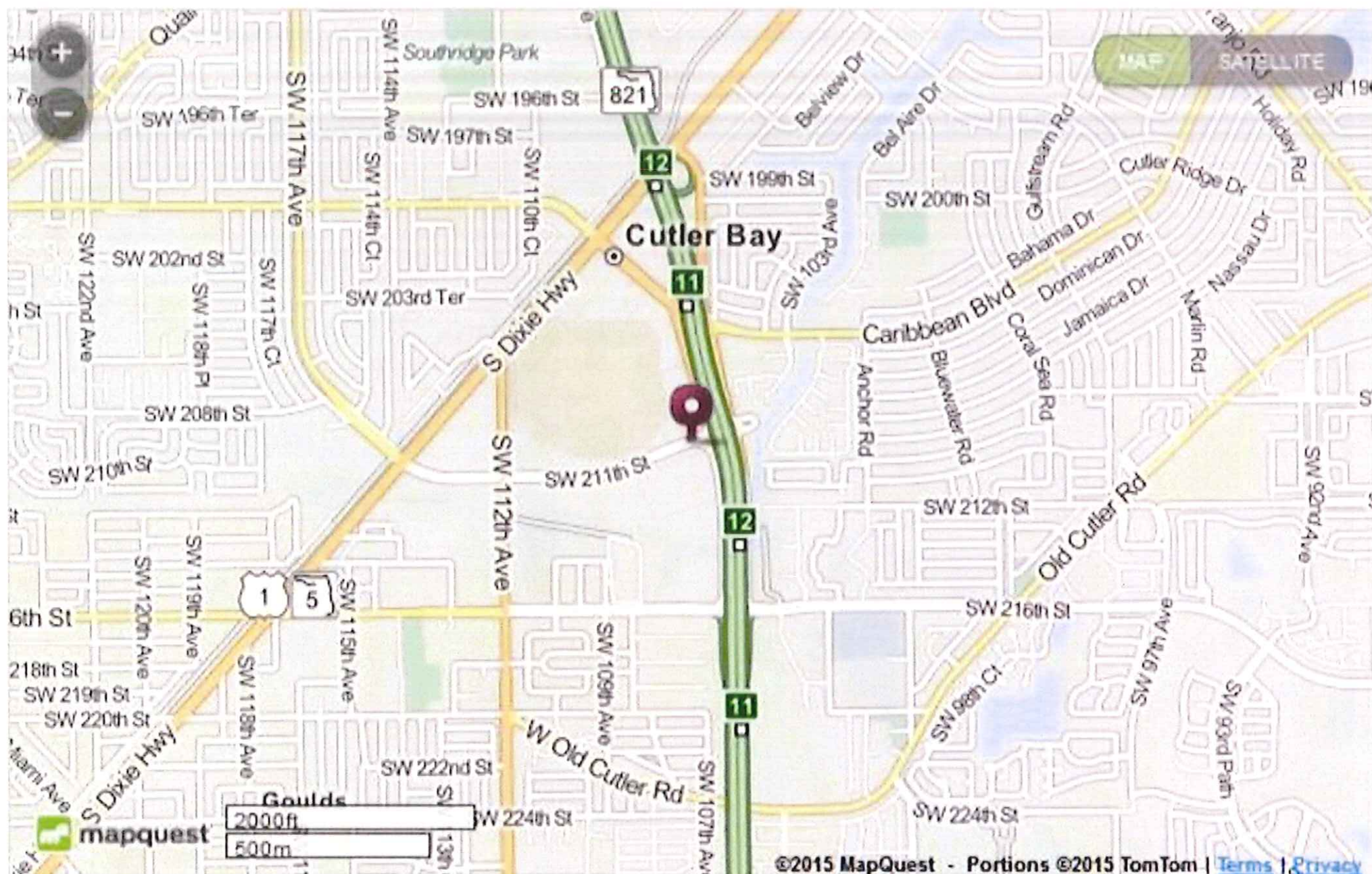

## About Us

The Humane Society of Greater Miami has been helping the abandoned animals in Miami-Dade County since 1936. We are a private, not-for-profit, 501 © (3) charitable animal welfare organization dedicated to placing every dog and cat in our care into a loving home, and to promoting responsible pet ownership and spay/neuter programs.

Today, more than 400 homeless dogs, cats, puppies and kittens are cared for every day at the Soffer and Fine Adoption Center in North Miami Beach and through our Foster Care Program. We are able to give these animals a second chance by providing food, shelter and medical care for as long as it takes to find them a kind and loving home.

After months of hard work and negotiations, the Humane Society has been awarded the contract to partner with the County to perform free spay/neuter surgeries at its South Clinic. This opportunity is specifically for low income qualified residents of Miami-Dade County and for all community cats. We are extremely excited to partner with the County on this very important initiative. We believe these efforts will be instrumental in helping the County achieve its goal of becoming a "No Kill Community."

The Humane Society operates two veterinary clinics, one in North Miami Beach and another in Cutler Bay. Our goal is to end our community's pet overpopulation problem. To meet this challenge, we performed more than 13,500 spay/neuter surgeries last year, and in 2015, our goal is to perform more than 20,000 surgeries. Programs are available that provide free resources for vaccinations and spay/neuter surgeries for those financially disadvantaged people of our community.

Every animal cared for at our shelter is free from the threat of euthanasia until their adopted family is found. In 2014, close to 3,200 animals found their human companions and began their new lives in homes around our community and South Florida. Before a pet is approved for adoption, we go to great lengths to make sure he/she is healthy, vaccinated and spayed or neutered. In addition, counseling and guidance are provided to make sure the right pet is adopted into the right home.



Staff and volunteers of the Humane Society of Greater Miami travel to schools, libraries, organizations and clubs to teach the community about responsible pet ownership and to promote the human/animal bond. Every year, through our educational program, more than 10,000 children and adults are taught about the importance of being kind to animals and about the seriousness of pet overpopulation.

Unconditional love and acceptance are two of the many rewards received by owning a pet. It is well documented that interaction with animals can significantly improve our physical and emotional health. The Humane Society of Greater Miami's Pet Therapy Program is designed to bring the unique and healing human/animal bond to residents and patients of healthcare facilities, rehabilitation centers, children's hospitals and senior citizen homes throughout Miami. Put as simply as possible, pets make us feel good!

We are entering our fifth and final year of the ASPCA partnership program with Miami-Dade Animal Services and The Cat Network. We have made huge accomplishments as a collaborative: we have doubled the number of animals that leave the Dade County animal shelter system alive! The partnership has been a truly rewarding and a very valuable experience.

The Humane Society of Greater Miami is a not-for-profit, charitable animal welfare organization supported solely by donations, private grants and fundraising events. We are not funded by the government and rely on our local community for financial support.

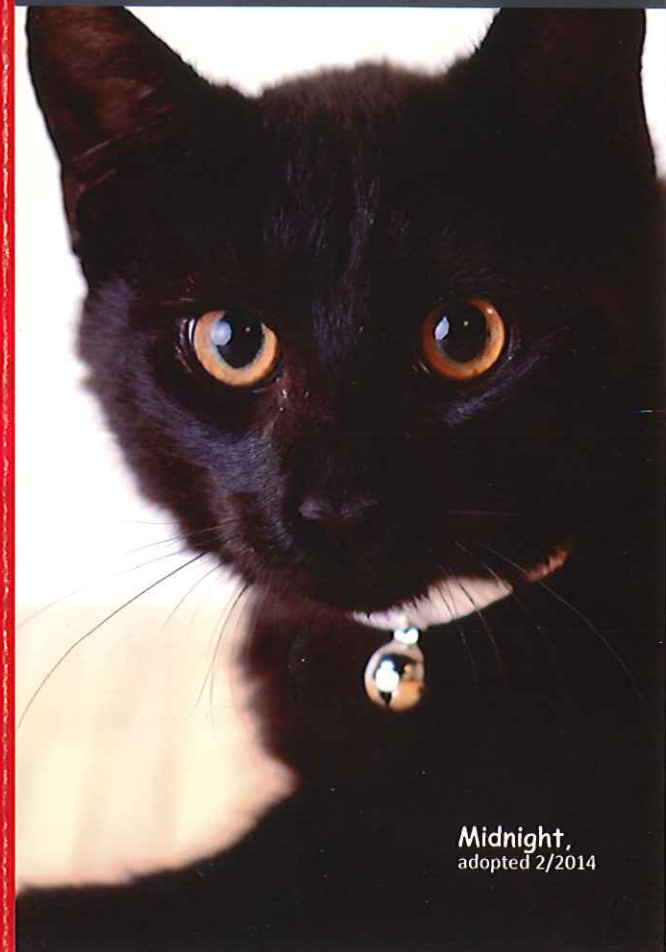

## How to Get Started

Volunteer orientations are given the first and third Saturday of the month at 12:00pm at the Soffer and Fine Adoption Center, 16101 West Dixie Highway, North Miami Beach. No reservation is needed for this meeting. Please arrive 30-60 minutes early as seating is limited.

## Volunteer opportunities:

### **Greeter/Gift Boutique**

Greet customers and assist them in navigating through the facility.

### **Dog Walker**

Exercise dogs to keep them in good mental and physical health.

### **Grooming**

Bathe animals in order to improve their looks and add to their comfort and health.

### **Pet Socialization**

Provide companionship and one-on-one interaction with a dog or cat.

### **Pet Photographer**

Take pictures of dogs and cats for our website, "Pet of the Week" or for internal use.

### **Outreach/Special Events**

Handle dogs, sell merchandise, distribute information, collect donations and assist with adoptions at malls, parks and other venues.

### **Pet Therapy**

Visit with residents of care facilities throughout Miami-Dade County to promote emotional and physical well-being. Pets must have a CGC certificate (Canine Good Citizen). Visit our website for more information about this opportunity.

### **Administrative**

Assist in filing, labeling and other administrative duties.

### **Kitchen Helper/Laundry**

Clean food/water dishes. Assist with washing and drying towels, blankets, sheets, toys, etc.

### **Clinic**

Assist in cleaning surgical instruments, wrapping surgical packs, making cone collars, cleaning cages.

## Foster Care

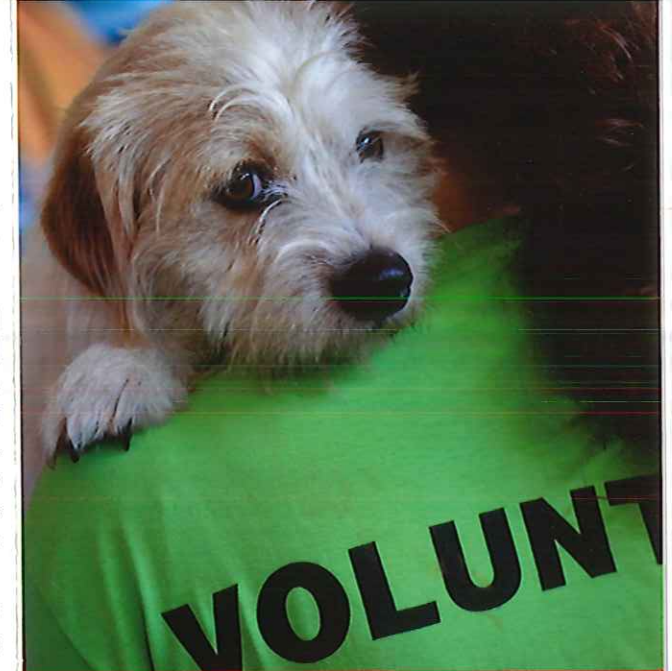
The heart and soul of the Foster Care program is the good people who take our animals into their home and make them a part of their family. Foster parents provide a warm bed, play time, give medication if needed, socialize their foster baby, and send us great photos and videos of the critter they are caring for.

Examples of animals that need foster care are: puppies and kittens under eight weeks of age; animals with special medical or behavioral needs; or mother animals with nursing litters. The Humane Society will provide all necessary food and supplies while you, the foster parent, provide the time, space, physical care, and social attention necessary for development of these special-needs animals. Fostering is an act of love; it is selfless, and it can be an incredibly rewarding experience.

To know that you have contributed to saving the life of an animal that otherwise may not have had a chance is a rewarding feeling that you will never forget.

## Adoption Ambassador

As an adoption ambassador you can take one of our orphaned dogs to dog friendly venues, dog parks, dog beaches, Humane Society of Greater Miami adoption events – or any other place where people can meet the dog. Ambassador foster families may be involved in the adoption process as well.

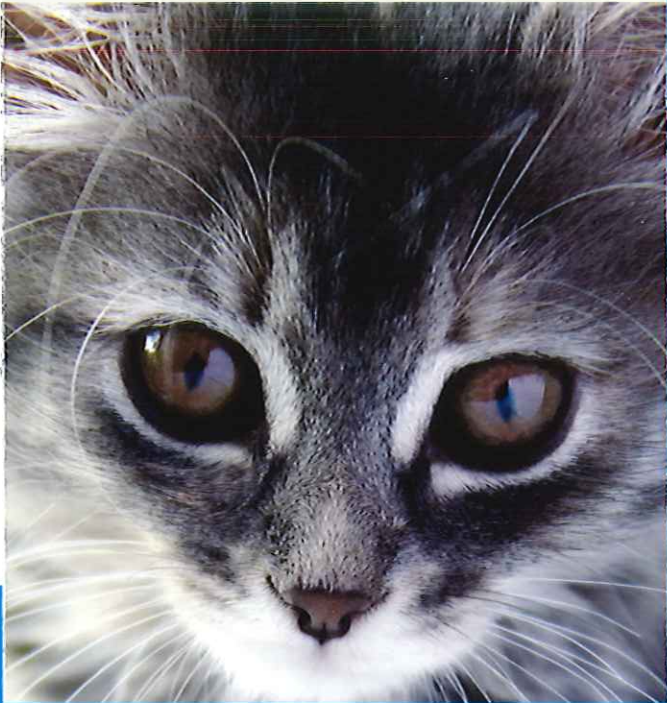

### Volunteer

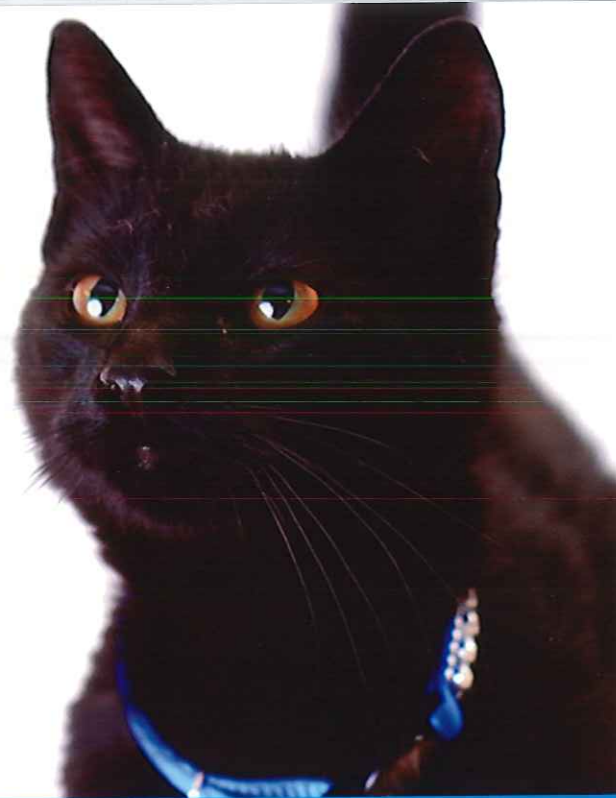

## Foster Care

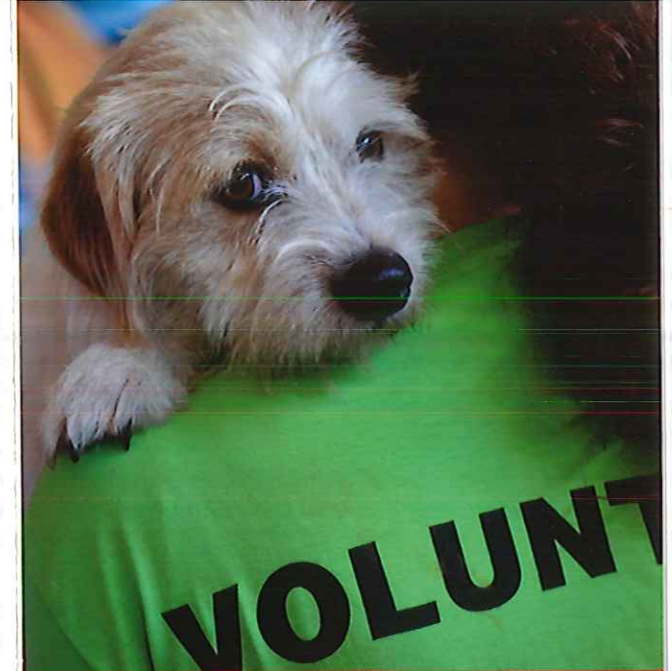
The heart and soul of the Foster Care program is the good people who take our animals into their home and make them a part of their family. Foster parents provide a warm bed, play time, give medication if needed, socialize their foster baby, and send us great photos and videos of the critter they are caring for.

Examples of animals that need foster care are: puppies and kittens under eight weeks of age; animals with special medical or behavioral needs; or mother animals with nursing litters. The Humane Society will provide all necessary food and supplies while you, the foster parent, provide the time, space, physical care, and social attention necessary for development of these special-needs animals. Fostering is an act of love; it is selfless, and it can be an incredibly rewarding experience.

## Vaccines

Most common infectious diseases can be prevented by routine vaccination. Additionally, routinely vaccinating your pet is always less expensive and much safer than treating your pet once she or he contracts the disease.

**Rabies** is a fatal virus that affects the central nervous system of almost all mammals, including humans. It is spread by contact with infected saliva in an open wound in the skin. Rabies vaccine should be given at 12 weeks or older, boosted in one year, then every one or three years depending on the vaccine used and the state law. Rabies vaccination is required by law for all cats and dogs.

**FVRCP** - Feline 3-in-1: This vaccine protects kittens and cats from Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Panleukopenia and Calicivirus. These viruses cause serious and sometimes fatal infections of the respiratory and digestive tract.

**DHPP** - Canine 4-in-1: This vaccine prevents certain upper respiratory, neurological and gastrointestinal viruses including Distemper, Adenovirus, Parvo Virus, and Parainfluenza. These viruses are very contagious and can be fatal to your puppy or dog. These viruses can be spread through air, nasal discharge or feces.

**Bordetella** vaccine can prevent a highly contagious disease called "kennel cough." This disease is easily spread among unvaccinated dogs. Most common clinical sign is a dry, hacking cough, but serious infection can lead to pneumonia.

## Flea and Tick Control

Unless protected, dogs and cats of all ages may be harmed by the bite from a flea or tick. The medical threat of these parasites can be fatal if left undetected and untreated, particularly if your cat or dog spends a lot of time outdoors. Fleas can cause flea allergy dermatitis, transmit tapeworms to your pet and in severe infestations, cause anemia. Ticks can transmit life threatening diseases such as Lyme, Ehrlichia and Anaplasmosis. Our clinics carry the latest products for controlling fleas and ticks.

## Heartworm Preventive

Heartworm disease is a serious and potentially fatal condition caused by 12 inch long parasitic worms living in the arteries of the lungs and right side of the heart of cats and dogs. **It only takes one bite** from an infected mosquito to transmit the disease and all cats and dogs, of any age or breed, are susceptible to the infection.

All dogs must be tested annually in order to renew their prescription for heartworm preventative. Please take the steps towards preventing heartworm disease.

## Important Tests

**Fecal Exam:** This test should be performed on your pet at least once a year. Fecal examinations detect microscopic gastrointestinal parasites, such as roundworms, hookworms, whipworms, coccidia and tapeworms. If parasites are diagnosed, the appropriate deworming treatment can be administered. Some additional actions you can take to prevent intestinal parasites are proper flea control, regularly sanitize your pet's bed/toys and remove all fecal material that your pet may come in contact with.

**FELV/FIV Test:** Feline Leukemia is a virus responsible for certain types of cancer and, like Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV), can also compromise the immune system making it more difficult to fight off disease or infection. Both of the diseases are highly fatal. If your cat tests negative, we recommend vaccinating against Feline Leukemia.

**Heartworm:** Testing for heartworm disease could save the life of your pet. It is required in order to fill your pet's prescription.

### Keep Your Pet Healthy

The Humane Society of Greater Miami knows preventive care is the most effective approach when it comes to pet health. We believe a focus on prevention is better for your pet and better for you.

The cost of prevention is often a fraction of the cost of treating a disease or a problem once it has become more advanced.

### Spay and Neuter

It is estimated that for every person born in Miami-Dade County, there are approximately 15 dogs and 45 cats also born. There are not enough homes for them all.

Core to our mission, we offer inexpensive spay/neuter services. Our spay/neuter initiatives are desperately needed so we can end the serious pet over-population problem that causes hundreds of thousands of pets in our community to be homeless, starving, and abandoned.

Spaying or neutering is the surgical sterilization of an animal. It is a routine surgery performed at the Humane Society of Greater Miami by a veterinarian while an animal is under general anesthesia. Programs may be available that provide free resources for vaccinations and spay/neuter surgeries for the financially challenged people of our community.

## Microchip Identification

A microchip ID is a small chip, the size of a piece of rice, injected under the skin between your pet's shoulder blades. This chip contains an identification number unique to you and your pet. Shelters and veterinary offices are equipped with scanners that will show your pet's ID number when scanned. As of August 17, 1998 all cats and dogs purchased or adopted in Miami-Dade County must be microchipped. Microchip your dog or cat at a Humane Society clinic today!

Proper identification could mean the difference between life and death for your dog or cat! Approximately 15 million dogs and 9 million cats enter shelters throughout the United States each year as strays, according to the American Humane Association. Tragically, only 19% of the dogs and 3% of the cats are ever redeemed by their owners. These percentages would increase dramatically if more pets were properly identified.
