

**RESOLUTION NO. 2018-84**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, RELATED TO SPECIAL EVENTS; AMENDING THE FY 2017-18 SPECIAL EVENT MASTER LIST TO INCORPORATE THE ADDITION OF THE EVENT TO UNVEIL THE PURPLE HEART ENTRY SIGNAGE PLANNED FOR THE INTERSECTION OF SW 136TH STREET AND OLD CUTLER ROAD; APPROPRIATING FUNDING NOT TO EXCEED \$3,500 TO COVER COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE EVENT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by Mayor Eugene Flinn)**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Palmetto Bay became the first municipality of Miami-Dade County, Florida to officially become a Purple Heart City on August 7, 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Council adopted Resolution No. 2017-107, which establishes August 7th as “National Purple Heart Day” in Palmetto Bay; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 2017-107, furthermore, provides that the Village shall honor those patriots who served the nation of the United States of America by publicizing the Village of Palmetto Bay Purple Heart City designation as the first in Miami-Dade County with the installation and unveiling of “Purple Heart” Signage at the entrance of Old Cutler Road; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Council desires to implement the requirements of said resolution and appropriate funding for an event to celebrate the installation and unveiling of the sign.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, THAT:**

**Section 1.** The FY 2017-18 Special Event Master List is amended to incorporate the addition of an event to unveil the Purple Heart Entry Signage planned for the intersection of SW 136 Street and Old Cutler Road.

**Section 2.** The Village Council appropriates funding not to exceed \$3,500 from the General Government Contingency line item to cover the costs associated with the event.

**Section 3.** This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption.

**RESOLUTION 2017-107**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING AUGUST 7<sup>TH</sup> AS NATIONAL PURPLE HEART DAY IN THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.** (Sponsored by Councilmember Karyn Cunningham and Co-Sponsored by Mayor Eugene Flinn, Vice Mayor John DuBois, Councilmember David Singer, and Councilmember Larissa Siegel Lara)

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Palmetto Bay became the first municipality of Miami-Dade County, Florida to officially become a Purple Heart City on August 7, 2016, in support of those patriots who served, shed blood, even gave their lives for the freedoms we enjoy.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** The Village of Palmetto Bay shall honor those patriots who served the nation of the United States of America by:

- A. establishing August 7<sup>th</sup> as National Purple Heart Day, in perpetuity as a Special Ceremonial Day for the Village of Palmetto Bay;
- B. insuring that the Purple Heart City flag flies in perpetuity at the Village of Palmetto Bay Municipal Center;
- C. encouraging all business in the Village to hire veterans seeking employment;
- D. publicizing the Village of Palmetto Bay Purple Heart City designation as the first in Miami-Dade County entrances on US-1 and Old Cutler Road;
- E. Considering veteran and Purple Heart parking spaces to be designated in all Village parks, Village Hall, library, and public

1 places and encourage businesses within municipal limits to do  
2 the same in support of our veterans;

4 F. Designating the Village of Palmetto Bay Veterans and Gold Star  
5 Family Memorial Monument Park as among the top priorities of  
6 the Village together with the American Legion Marlin Moore Post
